Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

After a successful course, the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate comprehension of how the task is part of a product development process

Skills and abilities

- demonstrate skills of engineering methods and approaches when planning and conducting project tasks or a study within predetermined time frames
- demonstrate the ability to apply the knowledge acquired through their education in professional work
- demonstrate the ability to describe, analyze and reflect on the results of their work experience and to present them orally and in writing to the client and at the university

Judgement and approach
